Greetings all,

Hope you are looking forward to hearing the new Power10 announcements in July? I think you will find that the Power10 portfolio has suddenly got much more interesting, with both the new hardware and the "Enterprise" features now available throughout the range.

A few updates to share

- IBM Support team has been very proactive this year, coming out with quite a number of useful tips and tricks aimed at helping you to avoid needing support in the first place, or if you do, how to quickly reach a resolution. A quick summary below.
- We are aiming for the ASEAN Power (AIX, i, Linux) meetup to be held towards the end of July and to focus on Power10 and Linux we hope you will be able to join us. As background I have had some successful discussions with AIX / i administrators encouraging them to move some of their companies Linux workloads on to their existing Power infrastructure. More and more applications now run on Linux on Power and using spare Power resources only improves the bottom line (and performance!).

Quick bites

AIX LED 554 hang reminder

Chris Smith from the support centre has provided a timely reminder of the old '554 hang'. This can often happen after an AIX upgrade or migration, and can be caused by the fact that default attributes (disk in this case) are not preserved across AIX fileset updates.. Try *chdev*! Link.

LPM improvements in PowerVM 3.1.3

Pete Heyman posed a good update in the PowerVM community covering some of the new features, such as:

- LPM will be allowed with optical devices defined (but with no media loaded).
- Automatic selection of the mover server network device will now be based on performance characteristics of the device, not just if it can transmit data.
- LPM supports n-2 hardware generations

A vulnerability in the AIX lpd printer daemon could allow a local user with elevated privileges to cause a denial of service (CVE-2022-22444). The lpd daemon is the remote print server on AIX.
